



Dear Mr. Nachman:

Pursuant to our discussion of April 3rd, 1964, directly after the Trustee's Sale held in the U. S. District Court in the matter of U.S. Milling and Mineral Corp., Debtor No. 63B6065, and as you suggested, Mid-Continent Uranium Corp.'s officers met with Mr. Ronald M. Brown, Attorney for the Small Business Administration, endeavoring to determine the possible allocation of valid liens and encumbrances that might be assigned to the Nivloc Mine.

At that time Mr. Brown pointed out that in addition to the Small Business Administration and Internal Revenue Service liens there was a total of \$39,204.66 in judgments as listed in the Nevada Title Guaranty Company's letter of January 24th, 1964 to Mr. Manuel Robbins that could be applied against the Nivloc Mine. Even if these judgments could be negotiated on the basis of 50¢ to the dollar, which is highly questionable, we are considering an additional sum of approximately \$20,000 over and above the bid price plus what sum the SBA might assign to the property. Thus we are talking about a total figure much greater than Mid-Continent would consider as a fair price for the property.

Accordingly, Mid-Continent respectfully requests the privilege of withdrawing its conditional bid of \$5,000 for the Nivloc Mine. We plan to discuss the Nivloc Mine further with the SBA in the hope that something might be worked out that would be satisfactory to Mid-Continent's board of directors.

Liberty Mine (Burbank No. 1, Burbank No. 2, and
Burbank No. 4 Patented Mining Claims)

We have not been able to ascertain through conversations with Mr. Brown and others if there are any liens or encumbrances against the Liberty Mine. It would be appreciated if the Trustee would hold our conditional bid of \$2,000 in abeyance until we have our Nevada legal representative check with the Nye County records. There appears a possibility that the previously mentioned judgments may apply also to the Liberty Mine.

Enclosed is a copy of a letter to Mr. Norman H. Nachman, Attorney for the Trustee, in the U. S. District Court in the matter of U. S. Milling and Mineral Corp., Debtor No. 63B6065. Mid-Continent has requested the privilege of withdrawing its conditional bids made on April 3rd, 1964 in the Court Room of the Honorable Michael L. Igoe, District Judge.

I have endeavored to explain the complications involved due to the possible disposition of the liens and encumbrances as well as the various judgments as listed in the letter of the Nevada Title Guaranty Company of January 24th, 1964.

In our informal discussion after the Proceedings, Mid-Continent stated to you it would be willing to pay a total of \$15,000 to the Small Business Administration for 100 percent interest in the Nivloc Mine in the event the SBA saw fit to fireclose on its First Mortgage, thus cleaning out all other liens, encumbrances, judgments and other claims. Mid-Continent further agreed to give the SBA a check for \$5,000 to guarantee that the company will pay a total of \$15,000 for the Nivloc Mine if the SBA forecloses on the property. Please advise me if this arrangement is still satisfactory with the SBA and Mid-Continent will immediately send you its check for \$5,000.

A second possibility was mentioned by you of the SBA foreclosing on the entire package and then selling all of the real and personal property involved on the basis of the SBA's equity. Mid-Continent would seriously consider this on a negotiated basis in view of a possible discount for cash.

I should like to mention again the newspaper notice published in the Tonopah paper two weeks ago by Esmeralda County stating that the County was selling all of the real and personal property of the U. S. Milling and Mineral Corp. on April 27th, 1964. It would be appreciated if you would let me know what action the SBA, having First Mortgage on this real and personal property, has taken concerning this situation.

Earlier today Judge Will sitting in Judge Igoe's place and stead entered an order requiring all persons, firms and corporations inserting liens and encumbrances against the Nivloc Mine to show cause why the bid of your corporation in the sum of \$15,000 should not be accepted. The aforesaid hearing is scheduled for August 31, 1964, at 2:00 P.M., C.D.S.T., which was the earliest date available.

We did not apply to the Secretary of the Interior for an extension of time in which to perform assessment work, since the applicable statute clearly does not pertain to the present situation. We also do not believe the restraining order entered on June 26, 1963, can affect the situation since a district court would appear to be without power to modify an act of Congress. We shall, however, file a proof of labor with the recorder of deeds of Esmeralda County before September 1. There are, however, serious questions of fact and law as to whether or not the work performed by Mr. Wike meet the requirements.

If an order approving the sale is entered on Monday, I shall advise you of the same by telephone. I hope that such notice will be sufficient for you to commence the assessment work before the September 1 deadline.

I have also heard a rumor that someone may bid the sum of \$17,000 for the Nivloc Mine at Monday's hearing. This case, however, has been marked by countless unfounded rumors and I do not know what merit, if any, should be given to this rumor. I only mention it so that you can take any action that you deem appropriate.

It appears that the description of the Nivloc Mine appearing on the exhibit enclosed in your letter dated August 12 is erroneous. I am enclosing herewith a copy of a letter from the Small Business Administration which sets forth the proper description.







On June 25, 1963, United States Milling and Minerals Corporation, a Delaware Corporation, filed a petition for the Reorganization of a Corporation under Chapter X of the Bankruptcy Act, in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, as cause number 63 B 6085. On June 26, 1963, Nathan Yorke of Chicago, Illinois, was appointed trustee of the estate of the petitioner and on August 31, 1964, an order was entered authorizing Nathan Yorke, as trustee, to sell his right, title and interest in and to certain real property belonging to the debtor to Mid-Continent Uranium Corporation for the sum of \$15,000.00 free and clear of all liens and encumbrance. This real property consists of thirty-two (32) unpatented lode mining claims, commonly described as the Nivloc mine and is located in Esmeralda County, Nevada.

At the present time the Company with whom I am associated, AZTEC MINING CORPORATION, desires to purchase the above described property but, have discovered, in a recent title search that a number of claims of lien on the property remain unreleased. These claims of lien were filed by the State of Nevada Employment Security Department during the period from August 1959 thru November 1961. My concern is the legal consequence to us if we do purchase the property.





Dear Mr. Wagner:

On June 25, 1963, United States Milling and Minerals Corporation, a Delaware Corporation, filed a petition for the Reorganization of a Corporation under Chapter X of the Bankruptcy Act, in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, as cause number 63 B 6085. On June 26, 1963, Nathan Yorke of Chicago, Illinois, was appointed trustee of the estate of the petitioner and on August 31, 1964, an order was entered authorizing Nathan Yorke, as trustee, to sell his right, title and interest in and to certain real property belonging to the debtor to Mid-Continent Uranium Corporation for the sum of \$15,000.00 free and clear of all liens and encumbrance. This real property consists of thirty-two (32) unpatented lode mining claims, commonly described as the Nivloc mine and is located in Esmeralda County, Nevada.

At the present time the Company with whom I am associated, AZTEC MINING CORPORATION, desires to purchase the above described property but have discovered, in a recent title search, that a number of claims of lien on the property remain unreleased. These claims of lien were filed by the State of Nevada Employment Security Department during the period from August, 1959, thru November, 1961. My concern is the legal consequence to us if we do purchase the property.

To aid us in this matter we desire to have a copy of the following:

- 1) The order dated June 26, 1963, appointing Nathan Yorke of Chicago, Illinois, trustee of the estate of United States Milling and Minerals Corporation.
- 2) The order dated August 31, 1964, authorizing Nathan Yorke, as trustee, to sell his right, title and interest in and to the Nivloc mine to Mid-Continent Uranium Corporation.
- 3) The order or final decree that disposes of or settles the liens held by the State of Nevada Employment Security Depart-

ment, or in absence of any disposition of these liens, a statement whether the liens were filed with the Trustee in Bankruptcy and the legal consequences if they were not.

4) Any other order, proceeding or information that would be of assistance in settling this matter.

One matter which I am confused about is whether state tax claims can be eliminated in a bankruptcy proceeding and, if so, how this can take place. Further, assuming that state tax liens can be eliminated in bankruptcy, would the same result apply where the state failed to file its tax claims with the Trustee in Bankruptcy.

As you might well imagine this matter is of extreme importance to us and the future of our corporation. It is for this reason that I would like to request the exercise of reasonable diligence and all due speed in handling this matter. If there are any costs incurred in obtaining this information, please bill this corporation. If you need to discuss this matter in greater detail, please call the undersigned at our expense.

RE: Liens on the Nivloc Property

This is to acknowledge your memorandum of October 6, 1970, pertaining to the subject matter. On the first page of your memorandum there are three different dollar amounts referred to as the aggregate amount of the liens owing to the Nevada Employment Security Department. However, I assume that you are certain that the amount we are now talking about is \$11, 016.59.

The only immediacy of the Nivloc liens problem pertains to the question of whether or not the Atlanta mill is to be placed upon any portion of the claim comprising the Nivloc property and therefore subject to such lien. If such will be the case, then the liens obviously have to be paid off prior to moving the mill onto such location. If the mill is not to be placed on such property, then I would think we could ignore the existence of the liens until such time as the Company anticipates commencing operations at the Nivloc. This is subject, however, to the assumption that the State of Nevada will take no immediate action to foreclose its lien, but will continue to merely sit on its rights.

Even if the Company does not intend to locate the Atlanta mill on the Nivloc claim, I think it would be well to immediately communicate with the Clerk of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, regarding clause no. 63b6085 and request a copy of the order appointing Nathan Yorke as the Trustee in the United States Milling and Minerals Corporation matter. I think you should also request a copy of the order of sale for the Nivloc property to determine that the Court order stated that the sale was to be "free and clear of all liens and encumbrances". It would also be well to inquire whether the State of Nevada Employment Security Department had filed its tax claims, now apparently constituting the liens, with the Trustee in Bankruptcy. It is possible that such claims may have been compromised and paid. I am not enough of an expert in bankruptcy law to know whether state tax claims can be eliminated in a bankruptcy proceeding and, if so, how this can take place. I think it would be worthwhile checking the matter because we are talking about a substantial amount of

money. It is possible that the Nevada Employment Security Department was served with notice of the bankruptcy proceeding and failed to file its claims. Of course, here we have the additional problem of real estate in the State of Nevada on which liens were filed and they may be totally unaffected by the bankruptcy proceeding unless the State of Nevada expressly waived or compromised the claim. However, the fact that the Trustee's deed purports to convey the property free and clear raises a question which must be pursued in this connection.

The fact that the deed describes the claims as "patented", while they are in fact unpatented is irrelevant. You have informed me that as a matter of fact the claims are patented. The only really important thing about the description of the property in the deed is that it describes all of the claims which we want described in the conveyance paragraph. I think it would be well to record in Esmeralda County, Nevada, a copy of the court order appointing Mr. Yorke as Trustee, as well as the court order providing for the sale of the property to Mid-Continent Uranium Corp.

The conveyancing language in the Trustee's deed dated August 31, 1964, by Nathan Yorke to U.S. Milling and Minerals only uses one conveyancing word, namely, "convey". Please check the Nevada statutes for the import of certain words of conveyance. As I recall, the use of particular words in Nevada conveyances may be significant.



The Nivloc Mine consists of 32 Unpatented mining claims located in the Red Mountain Mining District, Esmeralda County, Nevada. The claims making-up the mine, the filing date of the claim and its locator are as follows:

The basic chain of title for the mine is shown in Exhibit A and a more complete description of the instrument designated in claim of title is given in Exhibit B. The proof of labor recorded for each of the claims since they were staked are given in Exhibit C.

The current status of the title to the above named claims is:

- 1) Mid-Continent Mining has a 5/6 interest in the claims which was granted to them by deed, dated January 18, 1967, recorded in Book 3-X of Deeds, pages 18-19.
- 2) Sunshine Mining Corporation has a 1/6 interest in the above named claims which was granted to them by deed, dated January 18, 1967, recorded in Book 3-X of Deeds, pages 18-19. Sunshine has granted a lease and option to purchase to Aztec Mining Corporation to be exercised on or before November 30, 1970.

PROBLEMS

1) The first problem in the chain of title is with the Plata claims. The locator Ira B. Joralemon, Special, was the named locator for the claims in 1937. The next occasion the claims appear in the chain is in a quitclaim deed to George B. Thatcher as grantee and Desert Silver, Inc. as the grantor. By what means Desert Silver, Inc. had acquired title to the claims is uncertain and is not reflected in the records. It was noted, during the search, that Ira B. Joralemon had some connection with Desert Silver, Inc., but at this time that relationship is undetermined.

Further, at this time the location notice for Plata 7-11 inclusively has not been located, although proofs of labor for these claims are in the records beginning in 1939. (See Exhibit C infra). Between the years 1939 thru 1953 inclusively, proofs of labor had been filed on Plata claims 1-10 excluding Plata 11. Beginning in 1959 until the present proofs of labor were filed on Plata 1-11 except for 1964 where Plata 11 was again excluded. In the years 1954 and 1955, the proofs of labor were not filed for Plata's 5 thru 11, 1956 and 1957 the proof of labor were not filed for Plata's 7-11 and in 1958 the proof of labor for Plata 11 was not filed.

2) There are proofs of labor missing for the years 1954 thru 1957 inclusively, for the Walter's 1-3, and for the years 1956 and 1957 for the Vancouver's 1-3 and Desert's 1-6. Further, the proof of labor for the Desert's 1-6 are missing for the year 1964.

3) A number of claims of lien by the State of Nevada Employment Security Department against a mining corporation known by the Name of U.S. Mining & Milling Corporation or the U.S. Milling & Minerals Corporation have not been released, according to the Esmeralda County Recorder's Office.



To date, August, 1970, these liens have not been released and the State of Nevada responded to my letter of July 14, 1970, included as Exhibit D indicating these liens have not been paid.

- (4) The State of Nevada files a lien against the U. S. Mining & Milling Corporation on September 7, 1969, and to date, August, 1970, the lien has not been released nor has the State of Nevada answered by letter of July 14, 1970, (Exhibit E) requesting information as to the status of this lien.
- (5) The Trustee's Deed executed by U. S. Milling & Minerals Corporation and Nathan Yorke (Trustee) as Grantor's to Mid-Continent Mining Corp, Grantee, of all the claims carries with it the problem that an instrument indicating a substitution of trustees, Nathan Yorke instead of Sykes, has not been recorded.

Every right and remedy provided for in this deed of trust shall be cumulative of every other right or remedy of the Beneficiary whether herein, otherwise or by law conferred, and may be enforced concurrently therewith, and no acceptance of the performance of any obligation as to which the Trustor shall be in default, or waiver of performance of any obligation, shall be construed as a waiver of the same, or any other default then, theretofore or thereafter existing.

PURPOSE OF APPRAISAL

This appraisal was requested by A. W. Rischmiller. The purpose of the appraisal is to establish a replacement value on the mill and building directly connected with the mill operation, as of April 1958, and to establish a reasonable value on the other structures which are located on owned property.

The inventory of equipment, including rolling stock, office equipment and mobile homes for staff has all been verified and priced.

There is no intent to consider the mineral rights on the land in ownership value. Our value is established on the premise that there is adequate acreage to control the mill site and the Slime Pond area, plus the fact that the waters under Permit #15847 (March 16, 1954) and certificate #4838 (January 5, 1959) permits the usage of .53 cubic feet per second of water from Silver Peak Springs (the only water available in the area).

MILL BUILDING

There is a very fine structure for its intended purpose, but it must be understood that there are excesses in all features of the construction. These excess features guarantee the soundness of the building and assure the lack of maintenance for some time to come. Excess fottings and foundations, oversize lumber in the framing members, and the extreme excesses of the big tank bases havd added excess costs to the building but assure the ownership of long life for the structure.

The primary excavation, fill and roadways before mill structure was started actually represent \$46,700,00 in cost but were necessary to develop the present well-planned operation of the mill.

The structure is a mill-type building, wood framing and steel roof trusses with sidewalls and roof of G.I. There are 21,750 square feet in mill proper floor area, of which 12,319 square feet is concrete slab. The height of the structure is 48 feet at the ridge and 32 feet at caves. There are seven levels within the mill for the various operations, these levels being platforms anchored in most cases to the building columns. These platforms must carry heavy loadings and are therefore expensive but essential. All sidewall framing is 2 x 8 structural lumber. All columns (5-2 x 2 laminated) are bolted and all head and base plates, brackets, etc., are steel. All wiring is in conduit and adequate to service all motors and lighting.

All tank bases are lumber set on proper concrete footings and properly braced to sustain the immense weights when the big tanks are filled with the slimes. All heavy machinery, ball mills, big motors, compressors, etc., are on concrete bases, properly bolted. The bases for the gyratory crushers and the ball mills all have excess fottings.

The lumber in the bridge timber sizes, is in most cases heart lumber and is way above the grade used in mills of this type.

The above explanation is offered only to reconcile our ultimate replacement of a like structure.

Mill Building \$ 396,293.00

PRIMARY ORE BIN AND GYRATORY CRUSHERS

This structure has a floor area of 925 square feet. Because of the gravity feed of the ore to the crushers there are three levels in the building. The ore dumping platform requires excessive timbers to hold it in place and the ore bin throat, to the gyratory crushers, are all supported on excess concrete fottings and brackets. From this structure to the Ball Mill ore bin, is the conveyor house (100' long). This structure is only a housing to protect the conveyor belt to the automatic sampling device at the head of the Ball Mill ore bin.

The Ball Mill ore bin is a frame structure 667 square feet in area and is supported on big concrete fottings with oversize posts. This structure is the last process before the actual ore milling process begins. These three above described structures represent a value of \$ 2,530.00

Beside the primary crusher building is a structure designed as an ore bin with dumping platform and big timbers to hold the ore. The building is now used as a cyanide storage area. This building has a 700 sq.ft. floor area and is 20 feet high. It has a replacement value of \$ 3,500.00

There are two buildings at the mill entrance for parts storage and machine shop.

One structure is a frame building, 404 square feet with wood floors, G.I. siding and roof containing bins for bolts, valves, bushings, etc., and has a replacement value of \$ 1,200.00

Beside the above parts shed is the machine shop with floor area of 400 square feet @ 10 foot height and rea area 595 square feet at 14 feet 6 inch height. This structure is wood frame with G. I. siding and roof and wood floor. Replacement cost of \$ 3,450.00

The office building is a converted frame, compo roof, 5 room and bath building. 1020 square feet, wood sash, C.P. floors, wall board walls and ceiling, electric hot water heater, butane room heat, replacement cost as is \$ 3,000.00

There is one frame dwelling used by one of the mill men which is frame, compe roof, 4 rooms, with very rough finish, 420 square feet. This structure can only be given a utility value and our findings will be for value \$ 830.00

There is an old stone structure beside the office with two frame bunkhouses attached. The stone area is 1.158 square feet and the frame area 848 square feet. This structure is not used anc could only have a storage value. We are assigning an arbitrary value of \$ 800.00

There are two frame, G.I. siding and roof garages near the office area which again must be assigned arbitrary values as they are not necessary structures and are not used at this time. Our value \$ 800.00

North of the big spring is a truck repair shop, 24' x 41' frame, G.I. siding and roof with concrete floor slab and grease pit. Where this is a rough structure it has good utility for the ore truck repairs and we are assigning an arbitrary value of \$ 1,800.00

There are three Deiroiter Deluxe mobile homes at the office area which are used by the Staff. These trailers have been included in the equipment inventory.

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LAND VALUE

Where there is about 160 acres in the Mill Site, office area, and tailings pond, this area is described by mining claims and has only a utility value to this project. The value as mining claims could only be established by a geologist and we are therefore only considering a utility value for the area except the 10 acre fraction described as NE 1/4 of NE 1/4, Section 22, Township 2 South, Range 30 East. This fraction has good value because it is the area where Silver Peak Spring rises.

This property, 50 miles from Tonopah, Nevada, is serviced by a good surfaced road. The adequacy of sufficient water, the apparent efficient lay out of the mill equipment and the excellent staff operating the project all indicate a promising future operation.

Trustor promptly will pay or settle or cause to be removed all claims against any of the said property which affect the rights of the parties here-under; will appear in and defend any action or proceeding purporting to affect this deed of trust, the interest of Beneficiary or the rights, powers and duties of the Trustee hereunder, and Trustor will pay all costs and expenses, including cost of evidence of title and attorneys' fees in a reasonable sum, in any such action or proceeding in which Beneficiary and/or Trustee may appear.

6. Trustor will maintain an accounting system satisfactory to the Beneficiary; will allow Beneficiary to inspect at any time all records pertaining to the said property; and will furnish promptly and fully at any time upon







Enclosed is a copy of a letter to Mr. Norman H. Nachman, Attorney for the Trustee, in the U. S. District Court in the matter of U. S. Milling and Mineral Corp., Debtor No. 63B6065. Mid-Continent has requested the privilege of withdrawing its conditional bids made on April 3rd, 1964 in the Court Room of the Honorable Michael L. Igoe, District Judge.

I have endeavored to explain the complications involved due to the possible disposition of the liens and encumbrances as well as the various judgments as listed in the letter of the Nevada Title Guaranty Company of January 24th, 1964.

In our informal discussion after the Proceedings, Mid-Continent stated to you it would be willing to pay a total of \$15,000 to the Small Business Administration for 100 percent interest in the Nivloc Mine in the event the SBA saw fit to fireclose on its First Mortgage, thus cleaning out all other liens, encumbrances, judgments and other claims. Mid-Continent further agreed to give the SBA a check for \$5,000 to guarantee that the company will pay a total of \$15,000 for the Nivloc Mine if the SBA forecloses on the property. Please advise me if this arrangement is still satisfactory with the SBA and Mid-Continent will immediately send you its check for \$5,000.

A second possibility was mentioned by you of the SBA foreclosing on the entire package and then selling all of the real and personal property involved on the basis of the SBA's equity. Mid-Continent would seriously consider this on a negotiated basis in view of a possible discount for cash.

I should like to mention again the newspaper notice published in the Tonopah paper two weeks ago by Esmeralda County stating that the County was selling all of the real and personal property of the U. S. Milling and Mineral Corp. on April 27th, 1964. It would be appreciated if you would let me know what action the SBA, having First Mortgage on this real and personal property, has taken concerning this situation.

Dear Mr. Ebbley:

Pursuant to our discussion of April 3rd, 1964, directly after the Trustee's Sale held in the U. S. District Court in the matter of U.S. Milling and Mineral Corp., Debtor No. 63B6065, and as you suggested, Mid-Continent Uranium Corp.'s officers met with Mr. Ronald M. Brown, Attorney for the Small Business Administration, endeavoring to determine the possible allocation of valid liens and encumbrances that might be assigned to the Nivloc Mine.

At that time Mr. Brown pointed out that in addition to the Small Business Administration and Internal Revenue Service liens there was a total of \$39,204.66 in judgments as listed in the Nevada Title Guaranty Company's letter of January 24th, 1964 to Mr. Manuel Robbins that could be applied against the Nivloc Mine. Even if these judgments could be negotiated on the basis of 50¢ to the dollar, which is highly questionable, we are considering an additional sum of approximately \$20,000 over and above the bid price plus what sum the SBA might assign to the property. Thus we are talking about a total figure much greater than Mid-Continent would consider as a fair price for the property.

Accordingly, Mid-Continent respectfully requests the privilege of withdrawing its conditional bid of \$5,000 for the Nivloc Mine. We plan to discuss the Nivloc Mine further with the SBA in the hope that something might be worked out that would be satisfactory to Mid-Continent's board of directors.

Liberty Mine (Burbank No. 1, Burbank No. 2, and
Burbank No. 4 Patented Mining Claims)

We have not been able to ascertain through conversations with Mr. Brown and others if there are any liens or encumbrances against the Liberty Mine. It would be appreciated if the Trustee would hold our conditional bid of \$2,000 in abeyance until we have our Nevada legal representative check with the Ely County records. There appears a possibility that the previously mentioned judgments may apply also to the Liberty Mine.
